PART ONE: HOME TO BERING GLACIER

- I. Open Google Earth
- II. Search for your (or your partner's) house using the "Search" box.
 - a. Add a place mark (push pin) at your house.
 - b. Label it.
 - c. Color should be <u>yellow</u>, for both the place mark icon and its label.
 - d. Click "OK" to close the box.
- III. Search for "Bering Glacier, Alaska,"
 - a. Add a place mark (push pin) to the Glacier
 - b. Label it "Bering Glacier"
 - c. Change the push pin's color to pink or red.
 - d. Close by clicking "OK"
- IV. Starting at the Bering Glacier place mark, measure the length of the path from Bering Glacier to Your Home:
 - a. Open the ruler tool.
 - i. Change the measurement units to kilometers.
 - ii. Move the properties box out of the way, if you need to.
 - iii. Click the starting point at the Bering placemark.
 - b. Click the placemark to zoom to your home.
 - c. Click "Save" to save the measurement path, and to change its properties in the second box.
 - i. Title the path, "Bering Glacier to Home," change the color to <u>bright blue</u>, and the width to 3.0.
 - d. The length of the "Bering Glacier to Home" is ______.
 - e. Click "OK" to close the window.

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PART TWO: HOME TO GREAT LAKE

- V. Rotate (spin) the globe by clicking and dragging, so that you can see the Great Lakes.
 - a. Pick one of the Great Lakes (Superior, Huron, Erie, Ontario, or Michigan)
 - b. Place a marker in your chosen lake.
 - i. Label it with the lake's name.
 - ii. Change the pin's color to <u>purple</u>.
 - c. Click "OK" to close the window.
- VI. Starting at your "Home" place mark, measure the length of the path from Home to the Lake:
 - a. Open the ruler tool.
 - i. Change the measurement units to kilometers.
 - ii. Move the properties box out of the way, if you need to.
 - iii. Click the starting point at the Home place mark.
 - b. Click the "Lake [whatever]" place mark in the "Places" sidebar, to zoom to your lake.
 - c. Click "Save" to save the measurement path, and to change its properties in the second box.
 - i. Title the path, "Home to Lake," change the color to <u>red</u>, and the width to 3.
 - d. The length of the "Home to Lake" is _____.
 - e. Click "OK" to close the window.
- VII. Click on your Home place mark to zoom to the location of your home.
 - a. Find your school on Google Earth, and make another place mark there.
 - i. Label the school place mark "School," and color it green.
 - b. Using the path tool, trace your walking route to your school.
 - i. Label the path "Home to School," color it <u>orange</u>, and make it 3 wide.
 - ii. Click the "measurement" tab to see how far it is to your school from home.
 - iii. Right-click the "Home to School" path in the "My Places" section, then click "Show Elevation Profile" to see the contour of your path.

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
