

Pre-Service: Equipping our Future Educators

Almost 300 future teachers are learning about PLT and PWILD in their college courses each year. Fifteen faculty members, from universities throughout Oregon, have committed to incorporate the curriculum into education courses. Many of them are integrating the curriculum throughout the term to examine best educational practices and strategies. Students often use the curriculum to create their work samples and in their student teaching. The faculty meet as a "community of practice" to share their strategies, successes and challenges and in 2009 gathered with Washington faculty who are also engaged in environmental education practices. In May of this year the faculty will have an opportunity to meet with Richard Louve to discuss the role of teachers in connecting children to nature.

I have been having my students read an article about Vocabulary Strategies. I came up with an assignment that asked them to read the article, then to relate it to a lesson in their PLT book. They had to discuss the teaching strategies and explain how they would use the strategy to teach the vocabulary for the lesson. It has turned out to be a really good assignment for several reasons. One of my objectives was to get the teachers to carefully examine their book and look at different lessons.

It worked! They chose all kinds of different lessons to show how they could incorporate the teaching strategies.
